# OUR WORK THROUGH COMMUNITY FUND PROGRAMS



The Community Fund provided over \$130,000 in grants to agencies located in and providing services to the citizens of Liberty County. As a result of this funding, 22,025 Liberty County residents were assisted by United Way of the Coastal Empire funded agencies in 2022. In addition, 8,497 residents were supported through emergency resources and referrals at the Liberty County Service Center. Below are some of the ways we made an impact this past year.

### **SAFETY NET**

- 61,560 meals provided to 570 students for evening or weekend food assistance
- ▶ \$17,701 in emergency assistance distributed to 102 people
- ▶ \$14,639 in Emergency Food and Shelter Program Grants provided to local nonprofits to support those without stable housing

### **UPWARD MOBILITY**

- ▶ \$2,300 in transportation assistance distributed to 103 community members
- ► 5,564 books provided to students to promote early childhood literacy through Read United
- ▶ 719 senior citizens received supportive services
- ▶ 2,694 individuals received crisis and mental health counseling services

#### **MILITARY**

- ▶ 400 active duty soldiers and their families provided with emergency financial assistance
- ▶ 167 people provided with commissary cards to assist with food insecurity
